

CCTV – Have Your Say

Parishioners may be aware of a number of incidents of criminal damage that have occurred in the village over recent years. In order to try to deter this from happening in the future, the Parish Council is considering the installation of closed circuit television (CCTV) cameras in The Street and other parts of the parish.

Please be assured that any CCTV system installed would be used purely for safety, crime prevention and detection purposes. Its use would be subject to strict procedures to comply with the Data Protection Act, and to ensure that images can only be accessed by authorised personnel and only used for lawful purposes, and would not be retained longer than necessary. Before proceeding, the Council would carry out a privacy assessment and register the system with the Information Commissioner's Office. By law, it would be necessary to display approved "CCTV in Operation" signs in the village.

To assist us in making a decision on whether to proceed, and to help us address any concerns that may be raised, the Council invites parishioners to let us know your views and any comments or concerns you may have. Time to Check your Boundaries Please

With Spring approaching, now would be a good time to ensure that trees, bushes, and shrubs on your property are not encroaching or obstructing footpaths and roadways. We would ask everyone whose property is adjacent to roads, pavements, footpaths, etc, to check and trim back any vegetation that may cause difficulties for pedestrians and/or motorists. Please make sure that your trees and shrubs are not obstructing any road and other street signs, or reducing visibility at junctions, etc, and that salt bins, fire hydrants, drains, and other utility manholes are kept clear and easily accessible. If you are concerned about any encroaching vegetation that you see when you are out and about in the parish, please let us know.

Shorne Volunteers Litter Patrol

There is still time to join Shorne Volunteers' Litter Patrol on **Saturday 4th March**. Subject to suitable weather, we will meet up at the Village Hall car park at 09.45 to sort out the teams and equipment, ready for a 10 o'clock start. Speed Watch

Last month, we reported that Shorne Speed Watch team would welcome new volunteers to help monitor and discourage vehicles from speeding through the village, using equipment owned by the Parish Council.
