THE PARISH COUNCIL MATTERS

Shorne Common

As reported in the December issue, the Parish Council is arranging to cut back the self-seeded trees, bushes, and general vegetation around the perimeter of Shorne Common where it has encroached onto the green over the years. This will include the removal of one large limb which is in contact with the ground, and trimming back the canopy over the children's play equipment. Gravesham Borough Council has approved the work, which is expected to be carried out before the Spring. Balfour Beatty has also applied for approval to cut back branches overhanging the parking area, as part of their remedial works for the parking area.

Speed Limits

KCC Highways has agreed to extend the 30 mph speed limit in Forge Lane down to Shorne Crossroads. This will be carried out as part of a larger scheme which will see the speed limit in Gravesend Road reduced to 40 mph between Higham and Crown Lane, with further speed limit reductions in Rochester Road between Lion Garage and east of Thong Lane.

KCC Highways has also provisionally agreed to our request for a 20 mph zone in the centre of Shorne village, subject to design approval and public consultation.

In addition, KCC Highways has now installed "Slow" markings, a 30 mph roundel, and "dragon's teeth" markings on the road surface at the entry to the 30 mph speed limit in The Ridgeway, along with the restoration of centre white lines and cat's eyes.

Crutches Lane and Crabbles Bottom

Representatives of Shorne Parish Council and Higham Parish Council met with Police officers in Crutches Lane, Higham, to discuss actions to discourage indecent and anti-social activity in this area. Whilst Crutches Lane is in Higham where we have no powers, we will be looking at measures to discourage these activities in neighbouring Crabbles Bottom. The Police have stepped up patrols and visibility in the area.

HM The Queen's Platinum Jubilee

The Queen's Platinum Jubilee is scheduled to take place over an extended Bank Holiday weekend from Thursday 2nd June to Sunday 5th June, and the Parish Council is considering how we might mark the event in Shorne.
